REASONS FOR THE REVISION OF SYLLABUS

The existing syllabus of Malayalam language was introduced in the year 2019-20. Since then Malayalam Literature has witnessed substantial developments and transformation. The students need to be familiarised with these changes. Therefore, the Board of Studies decided to revise the existing syllabus duly giving weightage to old and modern literature.

PREAMBLE

It is the vision of our Institution to make the syllabus skill based, job oriented and socially relevant. In this context, the Department of Malayalam has given serious thoughts to the syllabus that it has comprehensively revised.

The creative and communicative Malayalam syllabus designed by the Department has set goals at various levels. At a lower level the goal is to drill students, in the four basic skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing. Towards this end the students will receive a basic course in Malayalam grammar and structures

At a higher level, the goal will be to make students cultivate effective communication skills, to hone their powers of expression and comprehension and to draw out their latent creativity. The syllabus, therefore, offers teaching/learning material as diverse as media and journalistic writing, business communication, poetry selections, short pieces of prose, fiction and drama. Creativity, as a higher objective, is expected to come to the forefront when the students come out with their oral presentations which they also present in the written format.

OBJECTIVES

- * To ground all students in the four basic language skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing
- * To hone their powers of comprehension, analysis and expression in Malayalam language
- * To draw out creativity and originality
- * To develop skills in public speaking, leadership and the histrionic arts
- * To shape their reading habits and make them well-informed young people

* To fit them out for careers at the local, national and global levels in the academics, the media, the corporate world and the administrative services

II. Aims & Objectives:

The study of Malayalam literature and language is important from the point of view of linguists. From the point of view of the Malayalam as a course of study, it is necessary to consider the following points to train the graduates.

- To build a skillful speaker/orator
- To develop a sensitive attitude towards the society and the community
- Developing a healthy attitude towards human values
- To develop a sense of tolerance towards different communities of the society
- To familiarize themselves with literary deliberations
- To develop the skill of critical thinking and creativity in the context of literary texts and building their imagination skills
- To establish a cross-disciplinary approach in the study and research
- To develop an inclusive approach, responsible citizenship, ethical thinking and socializing among students
- To train students in vocational skills appropriate for

These elements will also include that part of the student's awareness under which class, gender, caste, community and religion etc. are part of it, so that the students get familiar to the diversity in the world.

This course will be helpful in upgrading the competency of the students at various levels. Also, it serves as a determinant in explaining social complexity through literature. Along with literature, the understanding of language will also be developed in the students, with the help of analysis and evaluation. Their ability to get employed will be developed and at the same time, they will be able to enhance the ability for the same.
