Open Mic was an eagerly awaited program for students of St Aloysius. The event was diligently organized. There was a soul to it, a soul that was vibrant, contagious and





St Aloysius College Alumni Association gets the privilege of organising this Congress after 18 years.





Bird Box Making

The Bioscience Association is back to offline mode! The second year students of the association conducted the activity of bird box making on November 26, 2021.

Bird populations, especially sparrows and other passerine birds, are declining due to rising urbanization and the destruction of their natural habitats. Due to this, many of them end up in urban areas with hardly a few trees and nesting areas. With their declining natural habitats, bird houses or nest boxes offer a good option for their survival, by providing birds with a place to rest and raise their young. A bird box is a human-made, usually wooden box which is used as a house for birds. It is suitable as a bird house because it is similar to the natu-



ral occurring bird houses. such as a hollow tree and birds often make nests inside bird boxes Bird boxes provide a safe and secure location to lav eggs. All second year studont mem-

bers of the Bioscience Association involved themselves enthusiastically in making these bird boxes. Total of 8 bird boxes were distributed across selected shops that caught sight of sparrows around the city.
