Members expressed the desirability of having MoUs with premier institutions in the field with higher credentials so that the students might benefit by way of internships and hands on experience.

Members strongly supported the initiative of the College to introduce the programme.

Action Taken: The proposal will be sent for approval to the University after getting the ascent from the Governing Body.

Agenda-11 ACM 21: To consider and approve the proposal to introduce Psychology as one of the Core Disciplines within B.Sc Programme from the academic year 2022-23.

The initiative was appreciated by the esteemed members, especially in the aftermath of the pandemic. This would address some of the contemporary global concerns.

It was suggested that Psychology could be offered along with Biochemistry, Zoology, Chemistry and Food Science.

It was also envisaged to make the curriculum interdisciplinary by incorporating Social Psychology taking into consideration the contemporary context of the Pandemic.

The programmes could include Educational Psychology leading students to gainful employment in the field of teaching careers. Aspects of Industrial Psychology and Corporate Psychology also could be incorporated in the future.

Action Taken: The proposal under the nomenclature, M.Sc. (Clinical Psychology will be presented to the house in the next meetings. The same will be sent for approval to the University after getting approval from the Academic Council and the Governing Body.

The Committee is expected to submit a report and recommendations to the management within six months' time. An exclusive Board of Studies for programmes also is put in place.

Resolution: Approved subject to the final announcement of the Regulations and guidelines with clarity on specific action plan of implementation. Meanwhile, it was decided that as an academic family, a specific plan of action needs to be prepared to make the policy operational making use of the provisions given by UGC/ State Higher Educational Council/ Mangalore University.

Action Taken: The Institutional Taskforce has made several rounds of discussions and deliberations with authorities and has evolved a viable strategy/model in tune with the state and university regulations.

The College has prepared its own regulations, 2021 making use of the provisions of the policy, state, university regulations and the autonomous status. The regulations of the College will be proposed in the AC Meeting-21 for approval of the house.

All UG departments of the College have conducted their respective Board of Studies meetings and have designed the structures of curricula and course syllabi as per NEP regulations and will propose the same in the upcoming AC Meeting-21.
