1.After the formal welcome and introduction by the chairperson, chairperson himself read the minutes which were also put on the screen for the benefit of the members who were in ONLINE mode. It was approved

2. Thereafter the syllabus of third and fourth semester were discussed.

Since the NEP syllabus was prescribed by the Karnataka Higher Education Council, the break-ups of the syllabus were prepared by the members of the Department. Higher Education Council had given the course titles only. Prepared syllabus copy was already circulated among the members for their perusal beforehand.

The syllabus was also displayed on the screen. There were fruitful discussions. There were many suggestions from the members.

One of the members suggested that there should be uniformity in the syllabus and include history of the southern kingdoms in the Political History of India. The other members too were of the same opinion.

In the political history of India, Indus Valley was not of much relevance, as there is no clear-cut evidence as to show the political structures at that time. So, some of the topics were given up. Accordingly, enough topics from the history of southern kingdoms was also added. Some of the tiny kingdoms were removed as it would be too big a syllabus for a semester. Similarly, Cultural History of India, developments in the Southern region were also added.

Thereafter the Chairperson promised to re- draft the syllabus and send it to the members through the WhatsApp media. The members were again asked to make suggestions.

Thus, syllabus would become uniform, fair and holistic. All the members accepted these suggestions.

3. Once again it was decided that even though there is provision of the option of changing 20% of the syllabus though available, at this point the Department will not venture into it mainly due lack of clarity.


4. It was decided to continue the same Examination Pattern as well as question paper pattern which adopted for the first two semesters which is also on the model of the History subject of Mangalore University.
