The inaugural program concluded with the unveiling of the trophies for the various events of Insignia 2023.

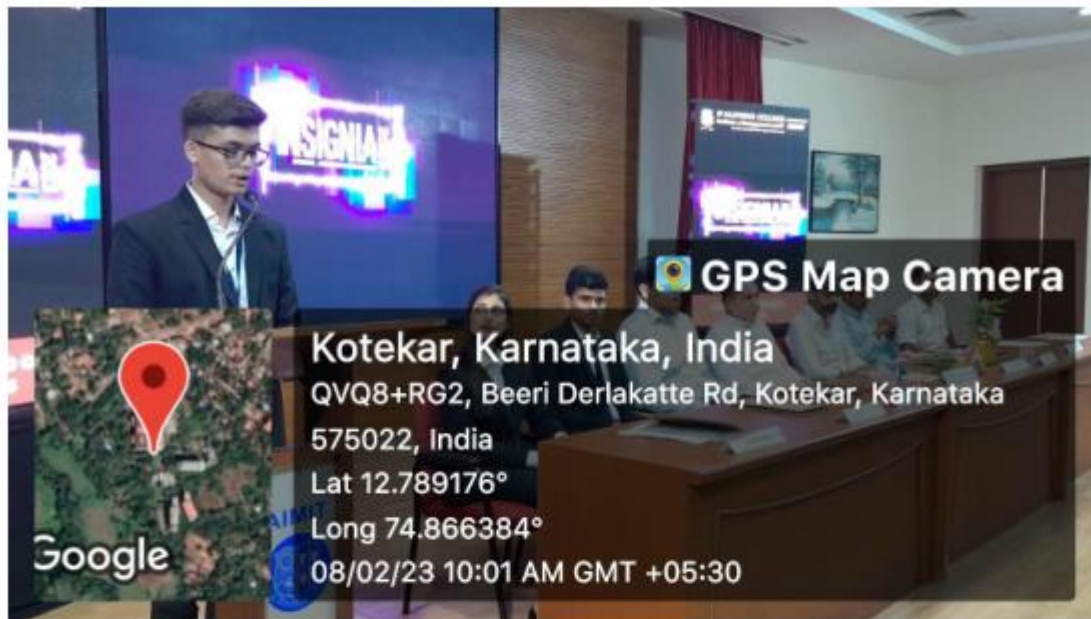
Valedictory Programme

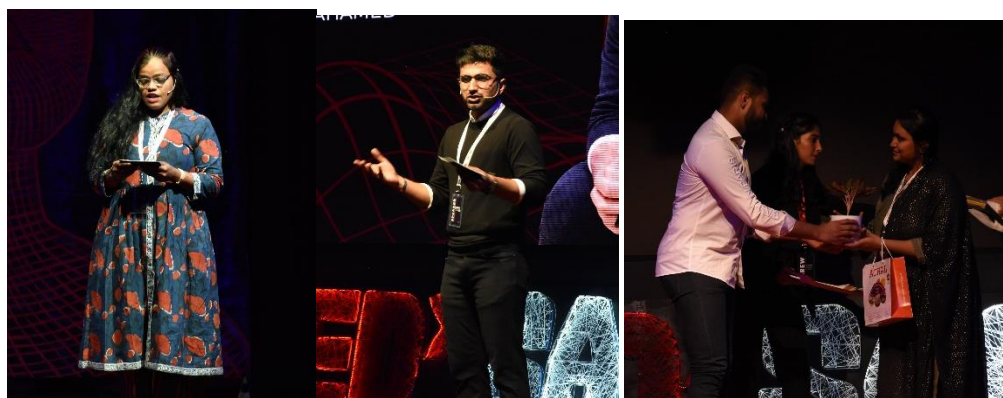
THE SECOND EDITION OF TEDxSAC : MANIFEST YOUR MATRIX
