





#### REPORT OF THE RURAL IMMERSION PROGRAMME HELD IN MUNDGOD AND HUNGAL FOR THE PG STUDENTS

St Aloysius College (Autonomous) aims at the integral formation of its students helping them to become **men and women for and with others.** The Postgraduate first year 382 students, were given an opportunity to live with the rural people in the villages of Mundgod and Hangal for 5 days. The Rural exposure Programme was planned with the objectives of:

- Providing a living experience of rural people in general and Dalit/ tribal life in particular
- Making students understand the rural social system and community living
- Helping students to be aware of the rural social problems and approaches adopted to solve them.
- Realizing the rich culture of rural India.
- Exchange of knowledge and skills between rural people and college students.

#### Nature of Rural Immersion Programme consisted of:

- Prior to the visit to the villages at Mundgod and Hangal (North Karnataka) 2 hours of Orientation was given by concerned block Directors, PG Dean and Dean of Extension Services. These sessions highlighted the purpose of the Rural Immersion Programme, emphasizing the significance of active participation and maintaining discipline. The orientation also provided an overview of the project and outlined the data collection process.
- Upon reaching the villages, students received another orientation by the Director of Loyala Vikas Kendre (LVK) by Fr Anil in Mundgod and by Fr Jerry, the Director of LVK in Hangal.. This session aimed to acquaint the students with the local culture, customs, and challenges faced by the community. It played a crucial role in fostering a deeper understanding of the village dynamics and enhancing the students' ability to integrate easily into the community
- To facilitate a more immersive experience, students were accommodated in village houses. Groups were carefully formed to ensure collaboration. This strategic grouping allowed students to match each other's strengths and perspectives while conducting the assigned projects.
- The students had an experience of living and sharing the life with the villagers. During their stay, students actively engaged with the villagers, conducting projects that focused on various themes and
- 79 topics. The data collected provided valuable insights into the socio-economic, cultural, and environmental aspects of rural life. The projects were designed to encourage students to apply their academic knowledge to real-world situations and foster a sense of responsibility towards the communities they interacted with.

- On the last day of the Rural Immersion Programme, an Evaluation was conducted in both the LVK centres, and the following questions were asked to reflect upon and to give their feedback :
  - 1. What are the happiest moments/most memorable experiences of the village stay?
  - 2. What are your sad experiences or unhappy moments in your village stay?
  - 3. What is the most touching experience?
  - 4. What are your key learnings from the experience?
  - 5. What are the key findings during your stay in the village?
  - 6. Do you recommend this exposure to your juniors?

- 92 Students belonging to Post graduate courses of MSW, Physics, Economics, MCom Fianance & Analytics, were distributed 2-3 each in each of the houses of the 8 villages of Mundgod : Kyasinkere, Nysarghi, Chavaddalli, Kalakeri, Kavalghi, Ugginakeri, Agaddi, Thumbarghi.

- 101 Students belonging to Post graduate courses of Chemistry, Analytical Chemistry, Food Science & Technology and Corporate Psychology were distributed 2-3 each in each of the houses of the to 10 villages of Mundgod: Nandigatta, Chigalli, Jogeshwara halla, Salgaov, Chavaddalli, maragaddi, Bharat mill, Chittagheri, Mallaghi, Koddambi



In **conclusion**, the Rural Immersion Programme proved to be a transformative experience for the 382 first year PG students. This Programme provided an insight and experience to the students about how life in rural settings is. It also gave an opportunity to students to get connected with people from different background and to learn things they would not learn in a closed room with books and a lecturer dictating the lesson. It offered them a unique opportunity to apply classroom learning in a practical setting, enriching their academic understanding. The program not only instilled a sense of social responsibility and cultural sensitivity but also highlighted the college's commitment to holistic education and community engagement.

#### **International Yoga Day**

In celebration of International Yoga Day, Radio Sarang collaborated with the Ministry of Ayush and CEMCA to host a series of yoga programs from May 30 to June 21, 2023. This initiative included posters, jingles, and informative talks by yoga experts, with daily sessions lasting about 20 minutes and repeat broadcasts in the evening. A live call-in program was held on June 21. The station effectively engaged listeners through various channels, including broadcast, narrowcast, social media, and word of mouth, reaching around 1,000 listeners who tuned into 90 percent of the yoga programs, while at least 10,000 individuals listened to at least one session.

#### Project Title – Har Ghar Tiranga and Meri Mati Mera Desh

With around 50 participants, the gathering fostered community spirit and a shared sense of purpose. Overall, the event successfully combined national pride with a commitment to sustainability. The CRS looks forward to organizing more such initiatives to strengthen community bonds and promote environmental consciousness.

#### Project Title - 'Say No to Violence'

On September 1st 2022, Radio Sarang had embarked on a significant project titled 'Say No to Violence,' in collaboration with NGO SMART and supported by USAID & MOMENTUM. This initiative aimed to raise awareness about the pervasive issue of violence against women. Continuing until 30th June 2023, Radio Sarang, the sole community radio in South India to receive this honor, played a pivotal role in reaching out to women in Dakshina Kannada. Through informative broadcasts, the station educated listeners on identifying signs of domestic violence and provided guidance on seeking help and accessing remedies. Through the broadcast and its extension activities, more than 12,000 people benefited from this program.





#### Flagship programmes 1. Hallo Wenlock

Radio Sarang continued with its flagship broadcast programmes. The weekly interaction with a doctor in Collaboration with District Wenlock hospital called 'Hallo Wenlock' completed 190 episodes. Every week listeners interact with the concerned doctor on various health issues. During this period, over 50 doctors visited Radio Sarang and participated in Phone-In Programs.



#### 2. Kala Sarang

"Kala Sarang," a fortnightly series launched in 2023, features presentations by literature and cultural practitioners, accompanied by bi-weekly dialogues with Bhaskar Rai Kukkuvalli. A special segment of the program showcases interviews with distinguished artists, retired chancellors, literaturists, educationists, and the the designers.



#### 3. Sutta Mutta

Sutta Mutta' is a bi-weekly series that commenced in 2022 and has now successfully aired 50 episodes. This series highlights individuals or organizations making unique and significant contributions to society. With a dedicated focus on showcasing talent and exemplary service, the program has garnered a substantial and loyal listenership.



#### **Guests Participated in Radio Sarang Events**

Sarang welcomed several distinguished guests, including notable figures such as Mr. U T Khadar, the esteemed Speaker of the Karnataka Legislative Assembly and Member of the Legislative Assembly representing Mangalore, and Capt. Brijesh Chauta, who elected as a Member of Parliament of Lok Sabha, an Ex-serviceman from the Indian Army who also serves as the chairman of the Mangalore Kambala Committee. Additionally, the studio hosted Sunil Siddhi, a renowned Actor and Drama Artist, among other prominent personalities, for both live and recorded programs.

On Independence Day, Radio Sarang aired special programs from 6 AM to 10 PM, offering uninterrupted coverage for 16 hours. Similarly, on November 1st for Kannada Rajyotsava, the station provided continuous programming from 6 AM to 10 PM, including a live broadcast from Nehru Maidan of Mangaluru.

More than 150 renowned guests participate in Radio Sarang's programs annually. Government officials are actively involved in Radio Sarang's programs. We have conducted awareness drives on dengue and malaria, broadcasting numerous related programs.

Students from Athena College of Nursing and Fr. Muller College of Nursing actively participated in and presented awareness programs on various health issues.



#### **Radio Sarang Exposure Visit**

Radio Sarang actively participated in the Regional Community Radio Sammelan, held at Anna University, Chennai, on February 13 and 14, 2024, organized by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. Additionally, they participated in a national-level competition organized by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.

Radio Sarang is actively participating in the Community Radio Association, Karnataka Chapter 1. As part of our study tour, Radio Sarang visited two community radio stations: Janadhwani 90.8 FM in Saragur, HD Kote Taluk, and Radio Neythal in Alappuzha, Kerala. During this tour, the Radio Sarang team learned how these community radios work with their communities, provide solutions to local issues, and educate listeners through their programs.
